

Welcome to your rental home in Sun City Grand.

We hope that your rental experience in our Community is enjoyable and rewarding.

As a renter you may, but are not required to, submit a copy of a signed lease showing the duration of the lease, or we must have something in writing from the owner with the required rental information. The lease must be for an initial term of no less than 30 days. One renter occupant must be 45 or older. There is a per-card use fee for renters (up to one year) which is as follows:

- 1 to 3 month lease = \$125 per person
- 4 to 6 month lease = \$150 per person
- 7 to 12 month lease = \$200 per person

To help you understand all the opportunities within Sun City Grand and the surrounding communities, we have prepared this packet for your review.



Personal training is available upon request. Please call 623-546-7456 for more information or to schedule an appointment. Additional written information on our personal trainers is available at either Adobe or Cimarron Fitness Centers.

Athletic shoes/socks and proper attire are required in the fitness center at all times and while attending all classes. You may wear a T-shirt or a tank top (no muscle shirts). Workout shorts and/or pants must be worn. You may not wear blue jeans, cut offs, belts or sandals.

Everyone is required to carry a towel at all times. Please dress appropriately and use your towel while working out. Also, antiseptic wipes are provided because you must wipe down the equipment after use.

You must sign up for all cardio-equipment use – 30 minute maximum on each piece.

#### FITNESS CENTER GUIDELINES



Each resident must show their Sun City Grand photo ID when checking in. Guests must be 16+ years of age to use the fitness rooms. Children are allowed in the <u>Adobe pool</u> only during designated children's hours. Cimarron is an adult only facility (16 and older). <u>No cell phones inside</u> Adobe or Cimarron buildings.

#### Fitness Room

When working out, please observe the following dress code:

- T-shirts or full-cut tank tops only <u>no</u> halter tops, muscle shirts (with gaping arm openings), half shirts, or sport bras worn alone. No full-button dress shirts.
- Elastic waist shorts & pants (zipper or button enclosure ok) <u>no</u> denim shorts or pants, no belts, no bathing suits.
- Must wear athletic shoes such as tennis, walking/jogging, aerobic <u>no</u> sandals or street shoes.
- Please refrain from using any cologne, lotions, etc. with fragrance.
- Guests must be 16 years of age or older to use the fitness rooms.
- No cell phones.

#### When using the equipment:

- Hand Towel is required for your personal use.
- Use Gym Wipes provided to wipe off equipment after each use. Only one wipe is necessary to clean the machine.
- Sign up for <u>all</u> cardio equipment, i.e. treadmills, cross trainers, Nu Step, bikes. Limit time to 30 minutes (including cool down) on each piece of cardio equipment. Cannot be reserved in advance. Must sign in for yourself.
- Return weights to their proper racks.
- Share the equipment.
- Drink plenty of water no other beverage or food is allowed.

#### Walking Track (Adobe only)

- Athletic shoes such as tennis, walking/jogging, aerobic shoes only <u>No sandals</u> or street shoes.
- Guests must be 16 years of age or older to use the track.
- No cell phones.

#### Adobe Pool Guidelines

- No lifeguard provided, swim at your own risk
- Children are allowed in the outdoor leisure pool area from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. and the indoor pool (open swim area) from 1-3 p.m. daily
- Sun City Grand swimwear must be worn by any child shorter than 42" tall
- No one under age 16 is allowed in pool areas except during children's hours
- Must be 16+ years old to use the hot tub
- Shower before entering pool or spa
- No running decks may be slippery. Street shoes worn on the street, regardless
  of type including tennis shoes, are not allowed to be worn into the pools
  and/or spa.

- Glass containers or alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the facility
- Smoking is permitted in outdoor designated area only
- Only adults (16 years and over) are allowed in or around the outdoor lap pool at all times. This includes the sitting area.
- · No jumping, diving or rock climbing
- Children must be monitored by an adult in the pool area at all times
- Please restrict use of indoor/outdoor spas to 15-minute intervals
- No refunds or credits will be given in the case of a pool closure
- Persons with cardiac-related conditions should consult a physician before using spa or sauna
- Persons with inflamed eyes, colds, nasal or ear discharge, skin or body infections or cuts shall be excluded from the pool
- No Band-Aids are allowed
- Shirt or top garment <u>must be worn</u> to and from pool areas

#### Cimarron Pool Guidelines

Flex Pass (60 Starts) - \$2,365. Expires 6/30/Yearly. Pay with cash/check and pay only \$2,340. Flex Pass (90 Starts) - \$3,535. Expires 6/30/Yearly. Pay with cash/check and pay only \$3,510.

The rates above do not include the use of the Association's golf carts. There is an additional \$10/person fee to use the Association's cart. No golf pass insures unlimited play. The outcome of all tee time requests is based on availability.

## INFORMATION FOR GOLFERS AT THE SUN CITY GRAND GOLF COURSES

(Revised January 2014)

Golf Shops: The golf shops are open one-half hour prior to the first tee time. The actual time varies according to the time of year and play for the day (straight tee times or shotgun play). The golf shops close at 5:00 p.m. Phone numbers are:

Residents receive a discount on most Golf Shop merchandise prices are marked on the tag.

League Play: Information (including registration forms) for the Men's and Ladies' Nine Hole leagues is located in the covered area next to the Snack Bar Desert Springs.

18-hole league information for both the Ladies Club and Men's Club is located at the Granite Falls Course, in the covered area on the SE corner of the cart building. League registration forms are located in the golf shop.

Information on the 150 Club is available just outside the Cimarron golf shop.

Signing up for Tee Times: Residents may sign up for tee times six (6) to fourteen (14) days in advance using the Chelsea automated tee time system. Requests are processed 6 days out, after which you may book a tee time by calling the golf shops. Prior to using the Chelsea system for the first time, residents must register at the Granite Falls golf shop.

"Play of the Day" calendars are available on a monthly basis for each of the courses. These calendars are helpful for planning your golf schedule and making Chelsea reservations. Please note: earlier t-times (than what are shown on the calendars) may be added, based on available daylight. Calendars are subject to change.

If a resident has at least 2 paying guests, reservations may be made up to two (2) weeks in advance by contacting the golf shop at the course you wish to play. If two guests are unable to play, at least two guest fees must be paid. Otherwise, the entire tee time must be cancelled at least 24 hours in advance. Please ask the golf shop for more information in regards to pre-booking with guests.

Check-In: All golfers must check in with the pro shop, and present their valid activity card, at least 15 minutes prior to their tee-time, including shotgun starts. Failure to do so may result in having that tee-time/hole assignment released to a standby golfer. Residents who do not provide a valid resident ID card will be charged the guest fee. There is no refund for inclement weather.

**Driving Range:** The driving ranges are generally open 7 days a week. They are generally closed for a few hours at a time two days a week for regular scheduled maintenance. Please check with the golf shops to find out the day and time each range will be closed.

Range balls and baskets are golf course property and may not be removed from the premise. Violators will be subject to loss of playing privileges.

**Attire:** Proper attire as described below applies to all players when playing one of the four Grand Golf courses at Sun City Grand.

#### **Shirts**

All men's shirts must have collars (mocks are permitted). Women's shirts may be sleeveless without collars, but must be designed for golf. Examples of inappropriate shirts are: t-shirts, muscle shirts, tank tops and halter-tops.

#### **Shorts**

All shorts must be mid-thigh in length, loose fitting and hemmed. Examples of inappropriate shorts are: cut-offs, denim shorts, sweats, athletic shorts, swimming trunks and the like.

#### Slacks

All slacks should be appropriate traditional golf attire. Examples of inappropriate slacks are: denim jeans or slacks with tears and holes in them.

#### Shoes

Grand Golf is a non-metal spike facility.

Relaxation of the above dress code as it applies to spectators is permitted as long as normal standards of decency and good taste are maintained.

All members should inform their guest of this policy prior to their arrival.

All dress code issues will be at the discretion of the Professional Staff and we ask that all members and guests honor their discretions.

Golf Carts: Only electric-powered golf carts, designed for only 2 people when playing golf, are permitted on the courses. All carts must be registered and licensed with the Arizona Motor Vehicle Department.

#### Surprise, Arizona

The City of Surprise is located 45 minutes Northwest of downtown Phoenix, and a similar distance from Phoenix Sky Harbor airport. Surprise offers a vast array of facilities and events, including the beautiful Surprise Stadium for Baseball Spring Training Camps, the Tennis and Racquet Complex, Surprise Aquatic Center, Dream Catcher Park and other beautiful City parks, a modern Regional Library, Communiversity, and more.

The City of Surprise ranks as the second safest city of more than 75,000 in the State of Arizona, according to annual municipal crime rankings published by CQ Press of Washington, DC. Nationally, Surprise ranks as the 29th safest city in the United States. (November 23, 2010)

Surprise has a population of well over 100,000, with more than 312 days of sunshine per year, and only 7" annual rainfall.

<u>Surprise Stadium</u> is the Cactus League home for Major League Baseball's Texas Rangers and Kansas City Royals Spring Training Camp in March of every year. Fans fill the stadium to support their team as they kick off the new baseball season every year.

The <u>Surprise Aquatic Center</u> provides summer fun for the entire family, with slides, flume and tunnel, and a vortex whirlpool. The competition pool has a diving well and two one-meter boards.

Surprise <u>Tennis & Racquetball</u> Complex boasts 25 tennis courts (17 with lights), a Pro Shop, table tennis, and 2 indoor racquetball courts. The 2500 seat Arena hosts National college tournaments and many other USTA certified events.

<u>Library</u>: The Northwest Regional Library is located in the Surprise Recreation Complex. This 23,000 sq. ft. Regional Library has a collection of over 40,000 items in all formats and offers over 60 Internet-accessible computers throughout the building. It is a model of the latest technology in the library and information field in terms of customer service with self-checkout, self-check in and Smart Library Cards.

Surprise <u>Communiversity</u>: College accreditation is formal recognition that a program, school, college, or university meets specific academic and educational standards that are set by nationally recognized accrediting organizations. Each Communiversity higher education partner has accreditation from a reputable agency.



<u>Dream Catcher Park</u> is a fully accessible, multi-generational, multi-purpose athletic facility designed to provide athletes with special needs a fun and safe place to play baseball, soccer and football.

The <u>Community Park</u> has an urban fishing lake, two sand volleyball courts, four basketball courts, and the Playground of Dreams.

The City of Surprise is host to many community events throughout the year, including the Memorial Day Parade, and the Fourth of July celebration which includes a baseball game, food and fireworks. There is also a City of Surprise Birthday Party the first week of December with activities such as hot air balloons, live music, carnival with games, rides, great food, skydivers, classic car show, craft show, and fireworks.

#### Near Surprise:

Surprise is just 20 minutes away from the nearly 30,000 acre White Tank Mountain Regional Park for those who like easy or difficult hikes, horseback riding, or just to get away for a picnic.

Lake Pleasant Regional Park is one of the most scenic water recreation areas in the "Valley of the Sun". This Northwest Valley park is a recreationist's dream. The park offers many activities, such as camping, boating, fishing, swimming, hiking, picnicking, and wildlife viewing. At the Lake Pleasant Visitor Center, guests learn about the history of the area and desert wildlife. Step out onto the balcony surrounding the Visitor Center to get a beautiful view of Lake Pleasant and an up-close look at Waddell Dam. ## Buyer Related Questions

How many homes are there in Sun City Grand? How many people live in the Community? We have 9,550 individual homes and 252 condos. Estimated population is 16,000. We are not a gated community.

Sun City Grand sits on 4,000 acres, and we have 400 acres of "common area" maintained by the Association. We have four 18-hole golf courses, and two fitness centers with exercise facilities in each. One center has an indoor pool, and two outdoor pools as well as an indoor walking track. The other center has an outdoor lap pool and an outdoor leisure pool that are connected, and a sauna. Each center has a jacuzzi.

What are the sizes of homes in Sun City Grand? Price ranges? What about the condos? The homes inside of Sun City Grand range in size from 1,096 sq. ft. to 3,388 sq. ft with the prices ranging from \$135,000 to \$570,000 for non-golf course homes, and from \$325,000 to \$925,000 for golf course homes. The condos range in size from 442 sq. ft. to 1,021 sq. ft with those prices ranging from \$71,000 to \$159,000.

What are the property taxes like for Sun City Grand? Sun City Grand is part of the City of Surprise and the Dysart School District so we have taxes from each of those elements which make up part of the tax bill. Contact your Realtor for an estimate of property taxes in general, or go online to Maricopa.gov to view the most recent tax for a specific property.

How much is the annual assessment and what does it cover? Every home pays an "annual assessment" which supports the amenities and the more than 270 staff members it takes to run the Community. The current annual assessment is \$1,266 per home. Each home is entitled to two Activity cards for the age-qualified occupants for use of the amenities.

What is the population breakdown for Sun City Grand? Sun City Grand is an agerestricted community primarily for occupants age 55 and over, but we allow up to 15% of our owners and/or renters to be age 45-54. We have 2% of our homes in the under-55 category so we have plenty of opportunities for the younger buyers. The average age as of January 2015 is 70.

Where do the majority of the residents come from? The state with the most buyers in the previous year was Arizona (39%) followed by Washington State (9%). Five percent of the buyers were from Canada. Owners come from all states in the U.S. and occasionally from other countries.



Are there medical facilities in the area? Banner Health Del Webb Memorial Hospital is located just outside the perimeter of Sun City Grand and there are many doctors' offices in the hospital area. Because of it's location between Sun City Grand and our neighbor Sun City West, the doctors and hospital largely treat the residents of our two communities. There are also many dentists, physical therapists, chiropractors, etc. located right here in the area. In addition, the world renowned medical facilities of Mayo Clinic and its specialty hospital are located in Scottsdale, easily accessible from Sun City Grand.

Does Sun City Grand have public transportation such as a shuttle bus or taxi service? Residents can utilize "Dial-a-Ride" at a very reasonable cost. There is taxi service. Several shuttle companies transport residents from their home to the airport, and back again when they return from their trip. There is bus service between Surprise and downtown Phoenix.

Are golf carts allowed on Sun City Grand streets? This is a "golf cart community" in that golf carts must be "street legal" with lights, turn signals, etc. They must be insured and tagged just like a car and are allowed on streets where the speed limit is no more than 35 mph. All streets in Sun City Grand are 25 or 35 mph - but no higher, so golf carts may drive on all Sun City Grand streets. You can get to some of the grocery stores and businesses on Grand Avenue using your golf cart (via Mountain View Blvd.) and you can cross Grand Avenue and get to the hospital and other medical offices and businesses in Sun City West.

**How are the finances in Sun City Grand?** Our annual budget is over twenty million dollars. Sun City Grand has thirteen and a half million dollars in the reserve fund. We are financially sound. We have very few homes in foreclosure.

How can I find a home to rent in Sun City Grand? There are rentals listed in the Grand Lifestyles magazine, and rentals on grandinfo.com (click on Grand Living and then Home Sales & Rentals). Most Realtors have property management departments with rentals available. You can also search on the internet for "Sun City Grand Rentals" and find listings there. A renter can purchase a renter card which entitles them to use of the facilities and amenities: 1-3 months \$125/card; 4-6 months \$150/card; and 7-12 months = \$200/card. Rentals must be a minimum of one month.

Can I see floor plans? Go to our website *grandinfo.com*, click on <u>Grand Living</u>, then <u>Home Floor Plans</u>. The 9100 series were the first models. The 9200 series were the last models, and are mostly found in Phase IV on the West side of Highway 303.
